#### 1. Introduction

1.1. Since the acquisition of the East Northants Resource Management Facility(ENRMF) in 2004, Augean (the Applicant) has sought to positively engage with the local community to promote a greater understanding of site operations as well as any planning or Environmental Permit applications. Many initiatives that reach beyond the requirements of legislation and guidance have taken place on a continual basis using a wide range of methods to create a relationship with the local community and its elected representatives to continue to build trust and understanding.

1.2. Consultation and informal engagement with the local community has allowed the Applicant to address concerns that have arisen and has given the company the opportunity to explain and discuss with the community concerns that have been expressed to them over a significant period of time. The Applicant has been aware of the sensitivities and potentially contentious nature of its proposals and the need to acknowledge this and therefore commit resources to give the local community access to information and site visits in order to reassure them.

1.3. The Applicant has been supportive of the local community having the opportunity to fully explore and understand the proposed application together with the process by which the application is determined.

1.4. The Applicant hopes that the iterative process that is defined by its policy of active, meaningful and continuous engagement has and will continue to provide reassurance to the local community. For that reason, engagement with the local community in all its forms will continue through to determination of the proposal and throughout the proposed lifetime of the site and its subsequent restoration and management until the surrender of the Environmental Permit.

1.5. The Consultation Report that formed part of the application documentation described the pre-application consultation process. This Communications Update describes the engagement activities that have taken place following the submission of the application to the Planning Inspectorate in September 2021 until July 2022

#### 2. Section 56 – publicising the acceptance of the application for examination

Statutory compliance advertising

2.1 The statutory advertising in accordance with Section 56 of the Planning Act 2008 has been documented in the certificate of compliance but is also appended here as Appendix CUA

Electronic Newsletter

- 2.2 In order to widely advertise the acceptance of the application for examination by the Planning Inspectorate (PINS) in the vicinity of ENRMF an electronic newsletter was circulated.
- 2.3The e-newsletter described in outline the background of ENRMF and summarised the proposed application. Details of the acceptance of the application by PINS were given and how members of the public could register with PINS and make representations. In order to make this process accessible and inclusive the contact details included the postal address, telephone number and web address of PINS as well as those of the Applicant. Information on how to access the application documents was given.
- 2.4 The e-newsletter was sent to all 47 Town Councils, Parish Councils and Parish Meetings within the 10km consultation area and to elected representatives; Members of Parliament and Councillors, Kings Cliffe Liaison Group members,

special interest groups, individuals who had responded to the pre-application

consultation and those on the Register of Stakeholders.

Local News Media

2.6 On publication of acceptance of the application for examination by PINS the

3.1. The Applicant has made significant efforts to maintain an open dialogue with

all key statutory consultees to ensure that they are frequently updated with the

progress of the application and have the opportunity to discuss and clarify

aspects of the proposals that may be of concern to t

#### 4. On-going community engagement

4.1. The Kings Cliffe Liaision Group (KCLG) gives a forum for the local community to raise concerns and facilitates direct dialogue with the Applicant. The KCLG comprises representatives from Parish Councils and Parish Meetings in the vicinity of the site as well as Councillors from North Northamptonshire Council (NNC), Council Officers from the Planning Department of NNC and Environment Agency Officers.

- 4.2. Since the submission of the application there have been three further KCLG meetings
  - 6 January 2022
  - 16 March 2022
  - 22 June 2022
- 4.3. The meetings each included a presentation from Augean with a site operational update as well as updates on the wider company and planning matters. NNC and the Environment Agency each gave reports.

Electronic newsletters and project email

4.5 The electronic newsletter was designed to enable efficient feedback, swift

response to issues arising, making public announcements and giving regular

planning updates and is a frequently used communications method with the

local community in the vicinity of ENRMF. The electronic newsletters often

contain links to additional sources of information or documentation. Regular

communications are sent out to elected representatives, all Town Councils,

Parish Councils and Parish Meetings, within the 10 kilometre consultation area,

members of the Kings Cliffe Liaison Group as well as the Register of

Stakeholders that has emerged from the pre-application consultation. These

#### Websites

4.7 The Applicant's company website gives company wide information about all operational sites and services. The dedicated ENRMF consultation website also has the function of acting as an important hub for access to documentation and has been regularly updated.

#### Telephone helpline

4.8 The dedicated helpline which was set up to allow members of the public, particularly those without access to the internet to questions, request further information, or raise verbal concerns is still operational.

#### News media relations

4.9 The use of news media relations has been important for the Applicant to provide a response to concerns in the vicinity of the site, and also nationally through the print and broadcast media thereby reaching a large audience. The company policy of openness and transparency and a willingness to respond to requests for interviews or statements as well as distribution of news releases has enabled the company to build good relationships with the media

#### Annual open day

4.10 It has not been possible to hold an Open Day at ENRMF in the last 2 years due to Covid 19 restrictions and ongoing uncertainty about infection levels which may impact on the critical infrastructure nature of the Applicant's business. However, it is hoped that an Open Day may be held in the early autumn of 2022.

#### Open door policy

4.11 The ENRMF has an open door policy in common with all of the Applicant's operational sites. Due to Covid 19 restrictions there have been no visits to the site since the start of the pandemic in March 2020. However the site visits are due to resume shortly with a visit by a member of the KCLG on 28 July 2022. The recommencement of the visits will be promoted in the next community newsletter and by electronic newsletter.

#### Company newsletters

4.12 A paper edition of the company newsletter was circulated to all households and businesses in Kings Cliffe, Apethorpe, Collyweston, Duddington, Easton on the Hill, Fineshade, Fotheringhay, Tixover, Thornhaugh, Wansford and Woodnewton in March 2022. A copy was also circulated electronically to the 47 Town Councils, Parish Councils and Parish Meetings within the 10km consultation area and to elected representatives;

MPs and Councillors, Kings Cliffe Liaison Group members, special interest groups, individuals who had responded to the pre-application consultation and those on the Register of Stakeholders. A copy is made available on the company website.

#### 5. Corporate Social Responsibility

5.1 As part of the Applicant's core business values of transparency, integrity and social responsibility the company seeks to provide reassurance to the communities in which it works that site operations should have a minimal impact. It is recognised that complaints about site operations should be fully investigated and resolved as quickly as possible. The company communicates these values through its actions to reassure, educate and invest in communities. The latest CSR report will be available on the company website at the end of July.

#### Reassurance

5.2 In response to previous requests from the local community, the Applicant has undertaken to publicly share monitoring results from ENRMF to reassure them that human health and the environment are protected through the design and operation of the site. These results are published on the company website

together with text explaining the scope and purpose of monitoring and how the

data that is produced can be interpreted.

Complaints

5.3 Complaints that are made about operational matters are swiftly and thoroughly

investigated and actions taken are reported back to the complainant. Only one

complaint has been made in the period following submission of the application.

• 16 September 2021- A complaint about road cleaning as dust and

debris were observed on the road. The complaint was investigated

and the CCTV records of the road at the time indicated by the

complainant were reviewed. These demonstrated that on the day of

the complaint contractors were installing a new fence and site gates

which may have discoloured the road surface with the movement of

building materials, this was cleaned by the road sweeper later in the

day. An offer to visit the site was extended and taken up.

#### The Augean Revenue and Small Capital Grants Fund

- 5.6 Due to the changes to local government in the area, the responsibility for the ENRMF Fund has been transferred to North Northamptonshire Council and has been renamed and rebranded as the Augean Revenue and Small Capital Grants Fund. A simplified and easier application process came into operation in March 2022 with three rounds of funding per annum. The last round of funding closed on 18 May 2022 with decisions due to be made by mid-July. The next round of funding will commence in September 2022.
- 5.7 Grants are available up to £5000 for capital costs and, unlike the Augean Community Fund, applications can also be made to cover running costs up to £10,000. Those within a 10-mile radius of the ENRMF site are eligible to apply, but with a preference to applications from within a 5-mile radius.
- 5.8 Since 2011 the separate LLW community fund has produced over £200,000. In 2020/2021, over £37,000 was contributed to community projects or organisations from the fund.

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities has accepted an application (the 'Application') for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") made by Augean South Ltd (the 'Applicant') of 4 Rudgate Court, Walton, Wetherby, West Yorkshire. LS23 7BF under Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 (the Act) for examination by The Planning Inspectorate. The Application was received by The Planning Inspectorate on 8 September 2021 and accepted for examination on 24 September 2021. The reference number assigned to the Application by The Planning Inspectorate is WS010005.

#### **Summary of the Proposed Development**

The Application seeks consent for the alteration of existing and the construction of new facilities for the recovery and disposal of hazardous wastes and the disposal of low level radioactive waste at the East Northants Resource Management Facility (ENRMF) Stamford Road, Northamptonshire, PE8 6XX.

The Proposed Development includes:

- The construction of new landfill void in the Proposed Western Extension for the continued disposal of the same range of predominantly hazardous wastes and a limited amount of low level radioactive waste (LLW) as deposited at the Existing ENRMF with a capacity of greater than 100,000 tonnes per annum (tpa) of hazardous waste which satisfies section 30(1) and section 30(2)(a) of the Act.
- A proposal for a coherent landform for the restoration of the Existing Landfill Facility and the Proposed Western
  Extension resulting in the construction of new landfill void in the Existing Landfill Facility to connect with the Proposed
  Western Extension with a capacity of greater than 100,000 tonnes per annum (tpa) of hazardous waste which satisfies
  section 30(1) and section 30(2)(a) of the Act.
- A total additional landfill void to be constructed of approximately 2.5 million cubic metres.
- The winning and working of minerals in the Proposed Development in order to create the landfill void and provide extracted materials for use on site as well as the exportation of clay and overburden for use in engineering, restoration and general fill at other sites.
- The temporary stockpiling of clay, overburden and soils for use in the construction of the engineered containment system at the site and restoration of the site.
- The direct input of waste into the Existing Landfill Facility and the Proposed Western Extension will continue at a rate of up to 150,000 tpa.
- An increase to the hazardous waste throughput of the Existing Waste Treatment and Recovery Facility from 200,000tpa
  to 250,000tpa which comprises an increase of 50,000tpa compared with the rate consented in the Original Order and
  the extension of the treatment area to the south while remaining within the Existing ENRMF footprint which satisfies
  section 30(3) and section 30(4)(b) of the Act.
- A combined total waste importation rate limit to site for the Proposed Development of 300,000tpa which is an increase
  of 50,000tpa compared with the rate consented in the Original Order.
- The LLW which will continue to be disposed of at the ENRMF and will be disposed of in the Proposed Western Extension will be limited to that which is at the lower end of the activity range and typically will have a level of radioactivity of up to 200 Bq/g.
- The diversion of the overhead electricity cable that crosses the Proposed Western Extension to a trench which follows the route of the water pipes across the Proposed Western Extension and then follows the western margin of the site to the northern corner.
- The operational hours of the site will not change from those already consented in the Original Order.
- Restoration of the whole site to generally domed profiles to create a coherent restoration landform.
- Restoration of the site to improved biodiversity and nature conservation interest using the soils available at the site as
  well as suitable imported materials. The site will be restored to a mosaic structure of woodland with shrubby edges,
  flower meadow grassland, scattered trees, hedgerows and waterbodies.
- Completion of the landfilling and restoration operations by December 2046 and removal of the Existing Waste Treatment and Recovery Facility.
- Retention of infrastructure until 2046 and the retention of long term management infrastructure beyond this date.



# Plans to expand hazardous waste tip

#### Objectors to plans to expand a landfill site for hazardous and low level radioactive waste have just three more weeks to have their say.

Specialist waste management company Augean want to add 2.5 million cubic metres capacity to the East Northants Resource Management Facility (ENRMF) site near King's Cliffs.

The extension would incorporate go acres of arable land - the equivalent of 68 football pitches.

The Development Consent Order (DCO) application is now with the Planning Inspectorate (PINS), and the agency is inviting people to register as interested parties and have their say on the plans by Thursday, December 9.

Augean opened the site

in 2004, and the expansion would create enough extra capacity to continue there for another 25 years.

The company's current licence to work the site ends in 2026, but the application also proposes to extend this to 2046.

Part of the proposed site falls in a strip of land separating the ancient woodlands of Fineshade and the national nature reserve at Collyweston Great Wood, a site of Special Scientific Interest (ISS).

The plans drew opposition from neighbouring villages and woodland conservation group, Friends of Fineshade, which fears it could threaten several species in the woods including adders, dormice, and newts.

After an extended fivemonth public consultation, Augean has modified its original proposals to allow the Friends to bring forward plans to link the two woodlands.



Augean want to add 90 acres to the ENRMF site and extend the licence by 20 years

Dr Gene Wilson, director of environmental planning for Augean, said: "The phasing of the proposed western extension area has been altered so that the northernmost area between the two woodlands can be worked, filled, capped and restored in around five to seven years from the start of

cell excavation work.

"This will bring forward some connectivity between the two areas of woodland at an early stage, creating links across what is now arable farmland."

Dr Wilson said a new watercourse would be created across the extended site, and claimed the plans would bring a biodiversitry net gain of 110 per cent for habitats and 550

per cent for bedgerows.

They also pledge to eventually turn over the site car park for public access to the land once restored, and create footpaths through it.

"The progressive

"The progressive restoration of the site as it is worked will steadily extend the mosaic of habitats, creating and improving linkages between the adjacent woodlands," he added. "Without the scheme

"Without the scheme being given permission the land will stay as arable farmland with little prospect of habitat creation and connectivity between the woodlands."

Because of its scale, the development is classed as a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project, with the final say going to the Secretary of State.

#### 2 Operators Update

- 2.1 GB provided a corporate update on Augean regarding the acquisition of Augean by Ancala/Fiera. John Rauch former Chief Operations Officer has been appointed CEO to the management Board otherwise, the company leadership remains the same. Ancala/Fiera have a similar Environmental, Social and Corporate Governance ethos to Augean are seeking to invest in the company to achieve growth. Therefore the day to day operational standards will be much the same.
- **2.2 PO** updated on management changes at the ENRMF on progress with landfill site operations:

Simon Moyle has left Augean and we are currently recruiting for permanent replacement

Interim site manager has been seconded. James Wathen is an experienced senior manager with 20yrs operational, environmental and health and safety experience with Augean. He was previously site manager of ENRMF and Thornhaugh and when not on secondment is the Group Head of Health Safety Environment and Quality (HSEQ) for Augean.

An update on new site manager will be provided to the liaison group at the meeting following their appointment.

- 2.3 Waste disposal is currently ongoing in phase 7 in the SW corner of the site. Engineering of phase 8/9 was mostly completed in 2021 and the final parts of the engineering and Construction Quality Assurance (CQA) testing are being completed now. It is anticipated that subject to final completion and receipt of approval from the Environment Agency waste placement will commence in phase 8/9 in Q1/Q2 2022.
- **2.4 PW** asked about void remaining in phase 7 and when operations would commence in 8/9, **PO** confirmed sufficient void remaining in phase 7 and that tipping would commence in phase 8/9 upon approval from EA in Q1/Q2 2022.
- 2.5 PO provided update on site entrance works and updated road signs. The site entrance has been widened to improve visibility and ease of access for vehicles. Augean has agreed to fund replacement road signs north and south of the site on Stamford Road. The designs have been approved and awaiting installation by the highways department.
- **2.6 PO** indicated that phase 10 at the site was capped at the end of 2021, **PW** confirmed that this cell was filled following an application to amend the phasing sequence at the site: **PO** confirmed this.

#### 3 Proposed Site Extension Application

**3.1 PO** provided an update on the extension application for the site

The DCO Application was submitted in early September and accepted for examination by the planning inspectorate on 24<sup>th</sup> September, the examination of the application is expected to commence in March 2022 (TBC)

The examination is a 6-month process and there will be continued opportunities for participation and consultation via the following:

- open floor hearings;
- issue specific hearings; and
- written representations.

Following the examination, the Inspector will have 3 months to prepare report to Secretary Of State (SOS) and the SOS has 3 months to decide whether to grant to DCO following receipt of the report.

**PW** asked for a timetable of the different parts of the process, **GW/PO** agreed to provide as soon as it was available from the planning inspectorate.

**PO** agree to provide a copy of the presentation slides with the minutes of the meeting.

#### 4 Environment Agency Update

**4.1 GWilk** confirmed the site inspection in August was satisfactory and the monitoring data submitted routinely as part of the sites environmental permit is reviewed by the EA teams on submission. **GWilk** confirmed they had no current concerns regarding the operation of the site

**AM** confirmed that there were no issues with the radiological regulation at the site, he also confirmed that the EA were expecting the upcoming Radioactive Substances Regulation (RSR) permit variation application and they had assigned an officer to determine the application







### 1. Apologies

Apologies were received from Greg Wilkinson (Environment Agency).

### 2. Operator Update

- 2.1 GB outlined changes in the company structure of Augean. John Rauch has become the new Chief Executive Officer now that Jim Meredith has retired following the acquisition of the company by Ancala and Fiera Infrastructure. Ian Jones has just been appointed as Chief Operating Officer. Mark Fryer, Group Finance Director is leaving the company and has been replaced by Sean Pottage this week. Chris Loughlin has taken over as the new Chairman of the Board.
- **2.2** The investment partners are committed to continue the robust approach to Environmental Compliance, Health and Safety and Social Responsibility. The latest Corporate Social Responsibility report will be available in April.
- 2.3 JW explained that Simon Moyle had now left the company and that he is the Interim Site Manager for ENRMF. He reported that the construction of Phases 8 and 9 have been completed and now that their construction has been approved by the Environment Agency, the first loads of waste have been emplaced.
- 2.4 There has been a reorganisation of site staff at ENRMF. Dave Simpson now takes responsibility as Site Manager for the Landfill and another new appointment has been made for Site Manager of the Soil Treatment and Recovery Facility. A new Site Chemist has also been appointed.
- **2.5** The Environment Agency visited the site on the 7 February 2022 for an inspection and had raised some issues as a result of their visit.

Degradation to Soil Treatment Plant pad.

It had already been recognised in the capital expenditure programme and provision made to do some remedial work to the concrete surface of the soil treatment pad. The surface has to be cleaned and scraped on a regular basis which wears down the surface and can create dips. The improvements have been scheduled for a dry weather period before laying the concrete. It was hoped that this would be completed this week and the EA would be updated.

• Dredging Lagoon near capacity

A large downfall of rain had meant that the dredging lagoon was towards the top end of its capacity. Recognising this pumping had commenced to correct the situation.

Stockpile vehicle breakdown

Unfortunately, on the day of the site inspection a vehicle managing the stockpile had broken down.

All the issues raised by the EA had been actioned.

- 2.6 PO reported that the new signage on the Stamford Rd had been installed. This was to replace the ad hoc road signs that had been put up by others over the last few years which were felt to be potentially confusing. As a result of liaising with Highways on the matter of improving the situation Augean agreed to fund the enhanced signage. The new signs should be effective in highlighting the potentially slippery road within the woodland area approaching the site.
- 2.7 Due to COVID it has not been possible to hold an open day at the site for the last two years. Now that restrictions have been lifted, the annual open day at the site will be held on the21st May 2022. It is an opportunity to see site operations, visit the laboratory and to ask the attending professional team any questions relating to the site or the planning and permit applications.
- 2.8 PW asked for clarification about the number of phases left to develop on the current site after the development of Phases 8 and 9. PO explained that only Phase 11 would remain, which is the area currently used by the Soil Treatment and Recovery Facility. He estimated that Phases 8 and 9 would take approximately 2 ½ years to fill. Management of the cell capacity has been advantaged by improved treatment techniques that reduce the contaminants enabling a reclassification of the waste. ENRMF has been able to divert this category of waste to Thornhaugh. PW commented that it was interesting to learn about the continued improvement in waste management techniques.

### 3. Proposed Site Extension Application

- 3.1 PO updated the meeting on the progression of the Development Consent Order (DCO) application. He explained that the Examining Authority had published his initial set of questions to which Augean and other Interested Parties had responded. He explained that examination process would be principally conducted through written questions and answers. Hearings would be held at the end of March and an unaccompanied site inspection would be held on the 5th of April. Interested Parties were required to inform the Planning Inspectorate if they wish to participate in these events. The examination process will last until August. The Examining Authority then has three months to write his report and give his recommendation to the Secretary of State for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities, who will make the final decision whether or not to grant a DCO.
- **3.2** Applications to vary the Environmental Permits for the landfill and soil treatment and recovery facility at ENRMF had been submitted and duly made. The permit for the treatment plant is being determined at present. The variation of the permit for radioactive waste is in preparation and an Environmental Safety Case is being prepared to accompany the application.

### 4. Community Funds

- 4.1 PO reminded the meeting that there were two community funds available; the community fund administered by Grantscape and the LLW fund which was part of a section 106 agreement. The LLW fund was set up with the intention of ensuring a greater flexibility for funding community projects as it can contribute to ongoing costs like salaries and maintenance rather than being restricted to capital funding of projects.
- **4.2 LH** explained that North Northants Council had changed the name of the fund to the Augean Revenue and Smaller Grants Fund. Applicants are invited to apply for revenue funds up to £10,000 and capital grants up to £5,000. Capital projects over £5,000 are directed towards the Grantscape administered fund and she had been working with them to ensure their objectives were aligned. A website for the fund has gone live. <a href="https://www.northnorthants.gov.uk/community-safety-and-emergencies/augean-revenue-and-small-grants-fund">https://www.northnorthants.gov.uk/community-safety-and-emergencies/augean-revenue-and-small-grants-fund</a>
- 4.3 The website has been tested by the advisory panel to make sure it is user friendly and self-explanatory. However, it does now require perspective applicants to give a greater range of initial information so that a better idea of projects can be formed at an early stage. There are three grant giving deadlines; January, May and September. The Councillors overseeing the distribution of funds are now Helen Harrison and Charlie Best (elected at the by-election to replace Annabel de Capel

Brooke). **PW** asked to be reminded about the 2021 sum of money that has accrued for distribution which **PO** agreed to provide.

### 5. Environment Agency Update

- **5.1** In the absence of Greg Wilkinson, **AM** confirmed that the issues the Environment Agency were to report on had already been covered by **JW**'s report and actions had been agreed to resolve the outstanding matters following the site inspection.
- **5.2** From the radioactive perspective, **AM** has been short of resources which has impacted on his ability to be proactive. However, another part time officer has been recruited which would help address this situation.
- 5.3 The reports that have been received from ENRMF show no real issues and he is comfortable with the operation of the site. In respect of site monitoring there are many monitoring points that have been included to provide reassurance. These are in excess of what is required by the permit and generated significant amounts of data so there is an intention to rationalise site monitoring.

### 6. North Northants Council update

**6.1 PW** reported that North Northants Council were participating in the examination of the DCO and had submitted their Local Impact Report to the Planning Inspectorate. NNC were shortly to submit answers in response to the Examining Authority's questions.

### 7. Any other business

**7.1** MD said that he had not be approached by any members of the local community wishing to raise any matters that needed consideration. He advised that it was helpful for Augean to keep communicating



### 1. Apologies

Apologies were received from Phil Watson (NNC)

### 2. Operator Update

- 2.1 PO welcomed everyone to the meeting, especially Helen Harrison (HH) and Marie Cooper (MC) who were attending for the first time. HH is the one of the Ward Councillors for the Oundle of NNC and is the Executive Member for Adults, Health and Wellbeing on the Council. MC is a new Parish Councillor for Collyweston who will represent the village on the Liaison Group. PO briefly introduced all the other members of the KCLG and explained the remit and purpose of the group.
- 2.2 GB reminded the group about the acquisition of the company by Ancala and Fiera Infrastructure in November 2021. He was pleased to report that the relationship between the new owners and the management team was exceptionally good and that the management team were being allowed to get on with business as usual. Augean's business plan was on track at the half year point despite the prevailing challenges of rising fuel and energy costs. During the Covid-19 pandemic, Augean had managed to keep all of its sites open and operational. GB wished to draw the group's attention to the Corporate Social Responsibility report which amongst other matters details the company's interaction with local communities. (note The 2021 CSR report will be available shortly)::https://augean.co.uk/csr/

- 2.3 PO explained that the previous site manager, Simon Moyle had left the company last year and that having had JW acting as the interim site manager for ENRMF a new site manager had been appointed. PO introduced Lottie Ball (LB) who is an experienced site manager. LB takes responsibility for ENRMF and Thornhaugh and will be the main point of contact in respect of any questions or problems regarding the day to day management of the site from now on.
- **2.4** He reported that Phases 8 and 9 are now being used for landfill disposal. To orientate the group **GB** made available an aerial plan of the site to show the current operational areas.
- **2.5** No complaints had been received about site operations.
- 2.6 A new and more efficient gas flare had been installed. The new flare is more suited to managing the reducing amounts of landfill gas from the older part of the site dating back to a time when waste with more organic material was disposed of into the site.
- **2.7** The Environment Agency (EA) visited the site on 31 May 2022 for an inspection of both the landfill and soil treatment plant. No scores were issued for either part of the site and note had been made of the improvements since the last visit:
  - Additional new storage bays at the soil treatment plant
  - Repairs made to the concrete surface of the pad.
  - Soil treatment pad much cleaner
- **2.8 PO** reported that the EA had requested some minor actions:
  - Some pipework needed to be sited within the containment area. This had already been scheduled for the end of June.
  - Part of the soil treatment plant infrastructure the bag splitter housing needed repairing. This had already been actioned.
- 2.9 Due to COVID it has not been possible to hold an open day at the site for the last two years. Now that restrictions have been lifted, it was hoped that the annual open day could be held in September 2022. It is an opportunity to see site operations, visit the laboratory and to ask the attending professional team any questions relating to the site or the planning and permit matters.

### 3. Proposed Site Extension Application

- 3.1 PO updated the meeting on the progression of the Development Consent Order (DCO) application. He explained that the examination period was ongoing and was scheduled to end on 2 August 2022. Two Issue Specific Hearings had taken place and there had been 6 formal deadlines for responding to questions posed by the Examining Authority
- 3.2 A late objection during the examination had been received from Anglian Water. Anglian have two water pipes that cross the proposed extension to ENRMF. Augean had been liaising with Anglian for 2 years and had agreed in principle a 7m stand off from the pipelines, however, the late objection from Anglian Water was against the proposed standoff distances. As a result, Augean were proposing amendments to the application known as a non material change that would give the flexibility to agree the final standoff distances at a later point. The proposed standoff distances would be somewhere between 7m and 30 m. PO showed the group a plan of the pipeline corridor with the proposed area of potential greater flexibility marked on the plan together with the restoration contours which easily could be adapted according to the standoff required. The non material change had been submitted to the Examining Authority and was the subject of a consultation that would run until 15 July 2022.
- **3.3 MC** having reviewed the consultation documents asked whether this situation was of concern and if would it be resolved through a separate agreement?
- 3.4 PO explained that there was no risk to the pipeline, the issue was centred on allowing access for maintenance or repairs to the pipeline. There was plenty of time to come to an agreement as that area of the extension would not be worked for another eight to ten years. In the overall scheme of the extension application the non material change represented a relatively minor change. GB commented that the water pipes already went along the southern boundary of the site with no impact from site activities.
- 3.5 Applications to vary the Environmental Permits for the landfill and soil treatment and recovery facility at ENRMF were being determined and consulted on at present. Some technical clarifications had been requested but the applications were progressing as expected. The variation of the permit for radioactive waste is in preparation and an Environmental Safety Case is being prepared to accompany the application.

### 4. Community Funds

**4.1 PO** reminded the meeting that there were two community funds available; the community fund administered by Grantscape and the LLW fund which was part of a section 106 agreement. The LLW fund was set up with the intention of ensuring

a greater flexibility for funding community projects as it can contribute to ongoing costs like salaries and maintenance rather than being restricted to capital funding of projects. (Details of the recent projects supported can be found on the accompanying PowerPoint presentation). If any help was needed by anyone in accessing the funds **PO** was happy answer any questions.

**4.2 LH** explained that North Northants Council had changed the name of the fund to the Augean Revenue and Smaller Grants Fund. Applicants are invited to apply for revenue funds up to £10,000 and capital grants up to £5,000. There had been a few teething problems with the assessment of applications process but this had been resolved. There had been 4 applications by the May deadline and these projects would be told if they were successful by the beginning of July. The next deadline for application is 1 September 2022. Depending on the call on funds there may be a third round of funding in January 2023.

### 5. Environment Agency Update

- **5.1** From the radioactive perspective, **AM** reported that he had not been able to visit the site in person but was hoping to schedule a visit in the near future and would be able to report back at the next meeting. He had been going through the data submitted by the site which looked good.
- 5.2 GW said that most issues had already been covered in PO/s report. He was pleased that housekeeping matters at the site that had previously been identified had been actioned in a positive way. He thought that the combination of a new site manager and new manager at the soil treatment plant would be a positive change to keep the site progressing well in the future.

### 6. North Northants Council update

**6.1** Unfortunately, **PW** was not present to give an update on Local Authority matters.





### **Augean Acquisition Completed**

Following a bidding process for the company, Augean are pleased to report that the acquisition of Augean PLC by a consortium of Ancala Partners and Fiera Infrastructure was completed in late October 2021. The company is no longer quoted on the Alternative Investment Market (AIM) and has reverted to the status of a private business. The business will be known as Augean and consequently you may notice some small branding changes to the website, email addresses etc.

Ancala and Fiera Infrastructure are long term experienced investors in the waste management sector. Ancala's experience in the sector includes Biogen, the largest owner and operator of anaerobic digestion plants in the UK. Fiera Infrastructure's involvement in the sector includes its investment in Cory Group, one of the UK's leading waste management, recycling, and energy recovery companies.

Although the ownership of the company has changed, the day to day management at a local level will remain unchanged. Augean's management team will remain in place and the company will continue to ensure that its services are delivered in a safe and compliant manner with due regard to its undertakings in respect of the communities in which it works and the environment. This ethos is shared by the new owners who are committed to provide the company with further necessary financial, technical and strategic support to maintain and improve Augean's high standards.

### **Laboratory Improvements**

The Laboratory at ENRMF is an integral part of the infrastructure of the site, allowing us to analyse small samples of waste to confirm that it is as described. This ensures that we know the exact make-up of wastes before they arrive and that they are suitable to be accepted at the site.

Augean have recently invested significantly in a new Total Organic Carbon (TOC) analyser which has now been successfully installed in the lab. TOC is an analytical test that measures the total percentage of organic carbon in a waste. This is an important capability to have in the laboratory as there is a limit of how much

organic matter there is in a waste when it is disposed of in a hazardous waste landfill cell.

The new instrument no longer requires the acidification of samples for preparation. With the removal of the acid preparation stage, the total time it takes to complete the test of a waste sample can be reduced by a day or two. As with any laboratory setting, health and safety risk is always a vital consideration. As there will no longer be the handling of acid, the risk of spillages or gas leakage, while already minimal, is reduced. The instrument itself should be more robust as acidic samples will no longer be put through it, reducing corrosion

on metal parts and therefore potential downtime and repair.

The new instrument will also allow us to analyse elemental (inorganic) carbon separately.



### New Appointments at Augean

Augean would like to introduce John Rauch who has been appointed as the company Chief Executive Officer. While new to the role, he is not new to Augean as he has been our Chief Operating Officer since 2016 and has already helped shape the company we are today. His existing knowledge of Augean and his extensive business experience mean that he is excellently placed to steer the helm as we go forward.

years, but who is no longer with the company. Therefore, we would also like to introduce James Wathen, who has been appointed as the Interim Site Manager. James is an experienced senior manager, with over twenty years of operational, environmental and Health and Safety experience. He will now be the primary contact at ENRMF for the local community until a permanent replacement is recruited.

### The Augean Revenue and Small Capital Grants Fund

The ENRMF Fund was set up as part of the planning consent to accept Low Level Waste at the ENRMF site and was formerly administered by Northamptonshire County Council. Due to the changes to local government in the area, the responsibility for the ENRMF Fund has been transferred to North Northamptonshire Council and has been renamed and rebranded as the Augean Revenue and Small Capital Grants Fund.

North Northamptonshire Council has also taken the opportunity to review how the fund is administered. Applications to the fund will now be assessed in three rounds of funding per year. A new application form has been created which will give details of these rounds, there will be a clear process and dates will be provided for when an applicant can expect to receive a response.

In 2020/2021, over £37,000 was contributed to community projects or organisations from the fund. Grants will be available up to £5000 for capital costs and, unlike the Augean Community Fund, applications can also be made to cover running costs up to £10,000. Those within a 10-mile radius of the ENRMF site are eligible to apply, but with a preference to applications from within a 5-mile radius.

The next round of funding, with the simplified and clearer application process, is expected to begin in early March with a deadline for applications by the middle of May. The assessment of applications will also be brought into closer alignment to that of the Augean Community Fund. North Northamptonshire Council will be widely announcing the exact details of this very shortly. These holidays rely completely on around 80 volunteers, with junior volunteers being paired with each of the holiday makers for the week to provide one-on-one care, overseen by experienced senior volunteers.

While the holiday gives a fun and interesting learning experience for the holiday makers, it also allows their families to have a much-needed break from the day to day responsibilities of providing direct care. For the volunteers it can also be a fundamentally changing

experience, altering preconceptions and giving insight and understanding of disability.

While there is a charge for these holidays, they are kept low with the majority of costs being subsidised through donations, fundraising and grants, such as the one from the Augean Revenue and **Small Capital Grants** Fund. ### **Augean Community Fund**

The Augean Community Fund in 2021 helped fund over £385,000 for community projects within a 10-mile radius of ENRMF in Northamptonshire and Thornhaugh Landfill near Peterborough. A further £170,000 of unallocated funding from 2021 is still currently available. There are two rounds of funding each year that allocate grants of approximately £500,000 per annum in total, up to a maximum of £50,000 for each project. The closing date for the next round of applications is 18 May 2022 and eligible projects will be informed of the decision by the end of August 2022.

Here are some examples of projects that have benefitted from the Augean Community Fund in the last round of applications.

Benefield Village Hall Grant: £32,134

Kitchen and wet rot refurbishment.

Ketton Sports Cricket Club Grant: £30,893 Renovation of the all-weather practice facility.

### **Nature Conservation and Habitat Creation**

Augean has an ongoing commitment to maintaining and enhancing the diverse habitats that surround ENRMF and monitoring the rare and protected species that can be found there. With the help of an independent ecology specialist, we have achieved great success in protecting the species and habitats present, which are also attracting exciting new species to colonise.



Habitat improvements include new ponds that have been created or restored in adjacent grassland, primarily to provide a resource for great crested newts, a specially protected amphibian. Nationally the populations of this species have been in decline as ponds and surrounding habitats are lost but the annual ecology surveys carried out at ENRMF have shown that these newts return to breed in these ponds year after year. Restoring and providing new breeding ponds will ensure that this continues. The ponds also support other amphibians such as the local palmate newt, smooth newt and a range of invertebrates including many damselflies and dragonflies.





The ponds are close to an extensive slope that forms the northern boundary of the site. This northern slope was struggling to establish sustained vegetation, so steps were taken to rectify this. Terraces filled with topsoil were created over part of the slope that were then seeded with a carefully selected mixture of plant species. Within just two years the slope was transformed from bare ground to a mosaic of grasses and wildflowers. Some important patchily vegetated areas were also retained to provide a foothold for further natural colonisation by local plant species and scarce invertebrates.

A range of reptile species are also present including the common lizard, slow worms and grass snakes. The elusive adder can also be found, the only venomous snake to be found in the UK. Reptiles have also benefitted from the habitat enhancements, with the margins of the ponds providing excellent basking and foraging opportunities and on the northern slope common lizards are already being recorded.
