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1 Introduction

- 1.1 Bazalgette Tunnel Limited (trading as 'Tideway') has the benefit of The Thames Water Utilities Limited (Thames Tideway Tunnel) Order 2014 (SI:2014/2384) (as amended)¹ ("the DCO") by virtue of a transfer of powers by Thames Water Utilities Limited dated 24 August 2015 made pursuant to Article 9 of the DCO.
- The DCO (as amended) granted consent for a 'waste water storage and transfer tunnel' (a "nationally significant infrastructure project" as defined in sections 14 and 29(1A) of the Planning Act 2008) between operational Thames Water sites at Acton Storm Tanks and Abbey Mills Pumping Station. The project comprises of one main tunnel which will capture and store combined sewage from combined sewer overflows ("CSOs") along its route and transfer the sewage to Abbey Mills Pumping Station. From there the Lee Tunnel will transport the sewage for treatment at Beckton Sewage Treatment Works. Twelve connection tunnels will link flows from CSO drop shafts to the main tunnel.
- 1.3 Bazalgette Tunnel Limited is making an application for a non-material amendment to the DCO under section 153 and paragraph 2(4) of Schedule 6 of the Planning Act (as amended). The application is seeking to amend:
 - the Site works parameter plan for the VCTEF site;
 - the Site works parameter plan for the BLABF site;
 - the Extent of loss of listed river wall plans at BLABF sheets 1 and 2; and
 - the Demolition and site clearance plans at BLABF sheets 2 and 3 (of 5).
- 1.4 These drawings are approved drawings listed in Schedule 2 Part 4 of the DCO. The proposed non-material change seeks to amend the approved drawings and revise the references to these plans in Part 4 of Schedule 2 of the DCO, and, in the case of the Extent of loss of listed river wall plans at BLABF, the references in Requirement BLABF 11 Details of works to listed buildings. Further details are provided in the Application Statement.
- 1.5 This Consultation and Publicity Statement is submitted under regulation 7A of the Infrastructure Planning (Changes to, and Revocation of, Development Consent Orders) Regulations 2011 (as amended) ("the 2011 Regulations") in support of the application to amend the DCO and provides:
 - a. a copy of the notice prepared in accordance with regulation 6 of the 2011 Regulations; and

 details of compliance with the requirement of regulations 6 and 7 of the 2011 Regulations.

2 Publicising the Application

- 2.1 Bazalgette Tunnel Limited confirms compliance with the requirements of regulation 6 of the 2011 Regulations as follows:
 - a. the notice of the application, including the matters prescribed under regulation 6(2) of the 2011 Regulations is to be published in the Evening Standard for two consecutive weeks (being 21st May 2020 and 28^h May 2020).
 - b. The notice of the application will confirm (among other things) that the application documents will be available for inspection via the Planning Inspectorate website.
- 2.2 A copy of the form of notice is provided at Appendix A of this Statement.
- 2.3 We are currently unable to safely meet all the requirements of regulation 6 (2)(d) as it is not possible to make a copy of the application available for inspection at an address in the vicinity of the proposed development. This is due to current Coronavirus (COVID 19) restrictions. Digital and paper copies of the application will be made available on request. This approach is supported by the Ministerial Statement made on 13th May 2020.

The proposals seek to amend the DCO by:

- replacing the Site works parameter plan for the VCTEF site with a revised version to correct an anomaly on the approved drawing and allow the works to be constructed as originally intended:
- replacing the Site works parameter plan for the BLABF site with a revised version to allow for minor adjustments to the locations within which permanent site structures can be located;
- replacing the Extent of loss of listed river wall plans at BLABF sheets 1 and 2 with revised versions to allow for modifications to the area approved for permanent loss;
- replacing the Demolition and site clearance plans at BLABF sheets 2 and 3 (of 5) with revised versions so they are consistent with the amendments to the Site works parameter plan and Extent of loss of listed river wall plan, and to add an additional area for demolition of below ground structures in case strengthening works are required;
- revising the plan references in Part 4 of Schedule 2 of the DCO; and
- revising the reference to the Extent of loss of listed river wall plans referred to in Requirement BLABF 11 Details of works to listed buildings.








Appendix B1 – VCTEF Land Plan and Consultation Boundary

On 6 November 2019 you also submitted a revised version of Table 2 of the request document entitled "Table 2 – Persons notified under S56 Blackfriars Embankment Foreshore (Rev 1)" which extended the list of persons or bodies to be consulted to include the City of Westminster and the London Borough of Lambeth.

The Applicant has requested that the Secretary of State give consent under regulation 7(3) of the 2011 Regulations, such that the Applicant only needs to consult those persons or bodies listed at points 1 to 17 on pages 13-14 of the request document in connection with the amendment proposed at Victoria Embankment Foreshore, and at points 1 to 17 on page 14 of the request document in connection with the amendment proposed at Blackfriars Bridge Foreshore. This is on the basis that the Applicant considers that the proposed changes do not give rise to any new or materially different likely significant environmental effects either within the Victoria Embankment or the Blackfriars Bridge Foreshores, or beyond the boundary of the works.

Tables 1 and 2 (as revised) set out a list of those persons who were notified of the acceptance of the original application for the DCO under section 56 of the Planning Act 2008, for the Victoria Embankment Foreshore and the Blackfriars Bridge Foreshore respectively. It is noted that this was based upon the list of prescribed consultees in Schedule 1 of the Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedure) Regulations 2009 (SI 2009/2232). The lists in Tables 1 and 2 (as revised) identify the parties whom the applicant proposes to consult and the parties whom the applicant proposes not to consult, with those parties proposed not to be consulted highlighted in grey along with the reasoning for not consulting them. This is reflected in the list of proposed consultees at points 1 to 17 on pages 13-14 (Victoria Embankment Foreshore), and points 1 to 17 on page 14 (Blackfriars Bridge Foreshore) of the request document.

Both the Secretary of State for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs and the Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government, who are the decision-makers for any requests and applications relating to the DCO (together, the Secretaries of State), have considered the request under regulation 7(3) in light of the requirements of regulation 7(2) of the 2011 Regulations.

Regulation 7(2)(b) requires consultation with each person that was notified of the acceptance of the original application for the DCO under section 56 of the

Planning Act 2008. The Secretaries of State have considered Tables 1 and 2 (as revised), and are satisfied that they set out all persons who should have been so notified. They are also satisfied that, for the reasons identified, those persons listed in greyscale are not directly affected by the changes being proposed, and that the persons not listed in greyscale are those who should be consulted.

Given the localised nature of the proposed application, the Secretaries of State agree that it is not necessary to consult all the persons notified of acceptance of the application for the DCO. The Secretaries of State are satisfied that the Applicant is proposing to take a reasonable and proportionate approach to consultation under regulation 7, which is in line with guidance provided by MHCLG. The Secretaries of State are satisfied that there are no other persons who may be directly affected by the changes proposed in the application, and who should therefore be consulted.

Accordingly, this letter gives written consent on behalf of the Secretaries of State under regulation 7(3) of the 2011 Regulations to more limited consultation in the terms requested by the Applicant in the request document. Given the forthcoming general election, the Secretaries of State recommend that this limited consultation should not commence until 13 December 2019 at the earliest.

In taking this decision, the Secretaries of State note that the public and others who will not be consulted under regulation 7 of the 2011 Regulations will have the opportunity to make representations because of the publicising requirements under regulation 6 of the 2011 Regulations and the opportunities to respond which that affords.

Finally, the consent in this matter should not be taken as any indication of approval for any other aspects of the proposed changes to the DCO (as amended), which may fall to the Secretaries of State for consideration and determination.

- replacing the Site works parameter plan for the BLABF site with a revised version to allow for minor adjustments to the locations within which permanent site structures can be located;
- replacing the Extent of loss of listed river wall plans at BLABF sheets 1 and 2 with revised versions to allow for modifications to the area approved for permanent loss;
- replacing the Demolition and site clearance plans at BLABF sheets 2 and 3 (of 5) with revised versions so they are consistent with the amendments to the Site works parameter plan and Extent of loss of listed river wall plan, and to add an additional area for demolition of below ground structures in case strengthening works are required;
- revising the plan references in Part 4 of Schedule 2 of the DCO; and
- revising the reference to the Extent of loss of listed river wall plans referred to in Requirement BLABF 11 Details of works to listed buildings.
