The Port of London Authority has reviewed the application by Bazalgette Tunnel Limited (trading as Tideway) for a non-material change to the Thames Water Utilities Limited (Thames Tideway Tunnel) Order (I:2014/2384) (as amended) (the “DCO”)1.

The proposal seeks to vary the DCO

- to allow the Tattershall Castle (a floating bar and restaurant) to remain moored in its current location at the Junction of Victoria Embankment and Horse Guards Avenue. The amendment also seeks consent for the permanent removal of the service mooring which was located to the east of the junction of Horse Guards Avenue and Victoria Embankment and which has been temporarily removed during construction of the works.

The Port of London Authority has no objection in principle to the details contained within the above referenced amendment.

In addition, the Authority has the following comments to make with regards to the application:

- The works consented under the Port of London Authority’s protective provisions have been consented and designed on the basis that they would be temporary in nature. As the supporting statement notes, these would need to be made permanent and the PLA would need to be assured under such an application (if the amendment is granted), that the works were sufficient.
- We have noted to Tideway that any permanent consent of the tidal works would be to them as Undertaker and the resultant obligations would be on the same basis.
