In respect of the adopted NPPF and its relevance to determination of the moving of the fully functioning sewage works to Green belt land between Horningsea and Fen Ditton. I cannot see any reasons as how the revised NPPF changes the argument against building here on Green belt land. It appears to me to strengthen the argument for protecting our environment and biodiversity.
